FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** assume no direct impact to medical services, but there may be an indirect impact. For example, if Corizon (DOC's contracted medical provider) is incurring more costs related to the increase in treatment, it may impact the cost of the contract. Per the contract, if there is a sustained increase in the cost of providing medical services, there is potential for the contractor to revisit the contract amount. This not only applies to medical services, but also to staffing.

Officials at the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assume there may be some impact but there is no way to quantify that currently. Any significant changes will be reflected in future budget requests.

Officials at the **Department of Health and Senior Services** and the **Department of Mental Health** each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

In response to a previous version, officials at the **Department of Social Services** assumed no fiscal impact from this proposal.
