FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Social Services** assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

Officials from the **Missouri Senate** anticipates a fiscal impact that is unknown due to not knowing the location or number of committee meetings. If costs are minimal, existing resources can be used.

Oversight assumes meeting costs will be minimal and therefore, absorbable within current funding levels.

Officials from the **Missouri House of Representatives** assume the proposal will have not fiscal impact on their organization. Joint committee expenses are typically covered by the Senate's Joint Contingent Expenses appropriation.

Officials from **Legislative Research (LR)** assume any clerical duties will be handled by House Research or Senate Research and thus, LR would not accrue additional expenses.

Officials from the **Office of the Governor** assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

Oversight notes the mission of the Joint Committee on Social Services is to "study and review the efficacy and efficiency of public assistance programs in the state including, but not limited to, the electronic benefit transfer program, MO HealthNet, temporary assistance for needy families, the supplemental nutrition assistance program, child care subsidies, and other assistance programs operated by the Department of Social Services". Oversight assumes the Joint Committee on Social Services may contract out this review. If so, it is possible contract costs could exceed \$100,000 in FY19 and FY20. The Joint Committee on Social Services terminates January 1, 2020.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION (continued)

The Joint Committee is to determine the level and adequacy of resources needed for the public assistance programs and develop recommendations to the General Assembly. The Joint Committee shall report a summary of its activities and any recommendations for legislation to the General Assembly by January 1, 2019. The Joint Committee shall terminate on January 1, 2020.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
