2 3	WHEREAS, in the United States and the state of Missouri, Veterans' Day has traditionally been celebrated on November 11th. This tradition reflects the end of World War I and the armistice of the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month; and

5 6	WHEREAS , this celebration of the heroics of our veteran community extends to all American veterans who served their country honorably during war or peacetime; and

8 9 10	WHEREAS , there are approximately 21 million military veterans in the United states, including 16.1 million living veterans who served during at least one war and 5.2 million veterans who served in peacetime; and

12 13 14	WHEREAS , the United States Congress could recognize the efforts of all veterans' by celebration of Veterans' Day each year by moving the tribute to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November; and

16 17	WHEREAS, in each even numbered year the celebration would coincide with the national election; and

19 20	WHEREAS, a no more fitting recognition of our veterans' community could be better than to have that honor be on the day that we renew our democratic election process; and

22 23 24 25	WHEREAS, that the creation of this national holiday would make the voting process more accessible, for all citizens, creating additional voting spaces and allowing those who wish to become more involved in the voting process, to vote, work as poll workers, and also endeavor to recognize the veterans' community:

27 28	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that we, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives, Ninety-ninth General Assembly, hereby urge the United States Congress and

29 the State of Missouri to consider moving the celebration of our country's veterans to the first

30 Tuesday after the first Monday in November because a national holiday for our veterans and for

31 voting in elections would be the most fitting tribute for those who have served; and
