AN ACT

To amend chapter 208, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the Missouri senior farmers' market nutrition program.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 208, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 208.285, to read as follows:

208.285. 1. The department of agriculture shall apply for a grant under the United States Department of Agriculture's Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program to provide 2 low-income seniors with vouchers or other approved and acceptable methods of payment 3 including, but not limited to, electronic cards that may be used to purchase eligible foods 4 5 at farmers' markets, roadside stands, and community-supported agriculture (CSA) 6 programs. 7 2. There is hereby established the "Missouri Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program" within the department of agriculture. Upon receipt of any grant moneys under 8 9 subsection 1 of this section, the program shall supply Missouri-grown, fresh produce to senior participants through the distribution of vouchers or other approved methods of 10 payment that may be used only at designated Missouri farmers' markets, roadside stands, 11 12 and CSA programs. The program is designed to provide a supplemental source of fresh 13 produce for the dietary needs of low-income seniors; to stimulate an increased demand for Missouri-grown produce at farmers' markets, roadside stands, and CSA programs; and 14

15 to develop new and additional farmers' markets, roadside stands, and CSA programs.

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3. Eligible seniors shall receive senior farmers' market nutrition program vouchers
or other approved methods of payment from designated distribution sites in their county
of residence. Upon the issuance of vouchers or other approved methods of payment,
participants shall be provided with a list of participating farmers, farmers' markets,
roadside stands, and CSA programs. The department shall provide distribution site
information at all county area agencies on aging.

4. For purposes of this section, "senior participant" means a person who is sixty years of age or older by December thirty-first of the program year and who meets the income eligibility criteria based on guidelines published annually by the United States Department of Agriculture.

26 5. The department may promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this 27 section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it 28 29 complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, 30 section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable, and if any of the powers 31 vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective 32 date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the 33 grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2018, 34 shall be invalid and void.

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
