AN ACT

To amend chapter 590, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to technology used by law enforcement.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 590, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 590.1100, to read as follows:

590.1100. 1. The department of public safety or the department of transportation may engage in discussions with local government officials or law enforcement agencies to develop a memorandum of understanding concerning the use of automated license plate reader systems and crime cameras by law enforcement on public roadways within the state. The memorandum of understanding shall contain detailed policies and protocols regarding the use of automated license plate reader systems and crime cameras, including specific policies on data retention.

2. As used in this section, "automated license plate reader system", means a system of one or more mobile or fixed high-speed cameras combined with computer algorithms to convert images of registration plates into computer-readable data.

3. Prior to August 28, 2019, the department of public safety shall promulgate, by rule, a standard for the installation of fixed automated license plate reader systems by government entities. The rule shall be posted on the department's official website.

4. The department of public safety shall promulgate all necessary rules and regulations for the administration of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions
