AN ACT

To repeal section 161.072, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to transparency of state board of education activities.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 161.072, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 161.072, to read as follows:

161.072. 1. The state board of education shall meet semiannually in December and in 2 June in Jefferson City. Other meetings may be called by the president of the board on seven days' written notice to the members. In the absence of the president, the commissioner of 3 4 education shall call a meeting on request of three members of the board, and if both the president and the commissioner of education are absent or refuse to call a meeting, any three members of 5 the board may call a meeting by similar notices in writing. The business to come before the 6 7 board shall be available by free electronic record at least seven business days prior to the start of each meeting. All records of any decisions, votes, exhibits, or outcomes shall be available by 8 free electronic media within forty-eight hours following the conclusion of every meeting. Any 9 materials prepared for the members of the board by the staff shall be delivered to the members 10 11 at least five days before the meeting, and to the extent such materials are public records as 12 defined in section 610.010 and are not permitted to be closed under section 610.021, shall be 13 made available by free electronic media at least five business days in advance of the meeting. 14 2. The public shall be granted a public comment period during every state board

15 of education meeting under this section.

16 **3. Each meeting of the state board of education shall be recorded by video, and**

17 such video recording shall be posted to the website of the department of elementary and

18 secondary education within forty-eight hours following the conclusion of every meeting.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

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4. The department of elementary and secondary education shall archive the video recordings described under subsection 3 of this section on its website in a manner that ensures easy and free accessibility by members of the public. Such recordings shall be retained, destroyed, or disposed of in a manner that is consistent with the procedures established by the state records commission created under section 109.250.

5. The department of elementary and secondary education shall not require members of the public to create an account, register, or provide any personally identifiable information in order to view the video recordings described under subsection 3 of this section. The department shall not collect, retain, sell, or otherwise use or make publicly accessible personally identifiable information of any member of the public viewing any such video recording.

6. Each member of the state board of education shall have an individual email
address that shall be made available to members of the public. Any member of the public
may email a member of the state board of education at such email address.

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
