AN ACT

To amend chapter 620, RSMo, by adding thereto nine new sections relating to broadband internet service.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 620, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto nine new sections, to be 2 known as sections 620.2450, 620.2451, 620.2452, 620.2453, 620.2454, 620.2455, 620.2456, 3 620.2457, and 620.2458, to read as follows:

620.2450. A grant program is hereby established under sections 620.2450 to 2 620.2458 to award grants to applicants who seek to expand access to broadband internet 3 service in unserved or underserved areas of the state, which shall be administered by the 4 department of economic development. For the purposes of sections 620.2450 to 620.2458, 5 the term "unserved area" shall mean a census block without access to wireline or fixed wireless broadband internet service. 6

620.2451. Grants may be awarded under sections 620.2450 to 620.2458 to fund the acquisition and installation of middle-mile and last-mile infrastructure that supports 2 3 broadband internet service to speeds of at least ten megabits per second download and one 4 megabit per second upload. 620.2452. Applicants eligible for grants awarded shall include: 2

- (1) Corporations registered in this state;
- 3 (2) Incorporated businesses or partnerships;
- 4 (3) Limited liability companies registered in this state;
- 5 (4) Nonprofit organizations registered in this state;
- 6 (5) Political subdivisions; and

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7 (6) Rural electric cooperatives organized under chapter 394 and their broadband 8 affiliates.

620.2453. 1. (1) An eligible applicant shall submit an application to the department 2 of economic development on a form prescribed by the department.

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3 (2) The department of economic development shall act as fiscal agent for the grant 4 program and shall be responsible for receiving and reviewing grant applications and 5 awarding grants under sections 620.2450 to 620.2458.

6 (3) The department of economic development shall develop administrative 7 procedures to govern the application and grant award process and to implement the provisions of sections 620.2450 to 620.2458. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is 8 defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall 9 10 become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 11 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable, and 12 if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, 13 to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held 14 unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted 15 after August 28, 2018, shall be invalid and void.

2. At least thirty days prior to the first day applications may be submitted each fiscal year, the department of economic development shall publish on its website the specific criteria and any quantitative weighting scheme or scoring system the department will use to evaluate or rank applications and award grants under section 620.2456.

620.2454. An application for a grant under sections 620.2450 to 620.2458 shall 2 include the following information:

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(1) The location of the proposed project;

4 (2) A description of the kind and amount of broadband internet infrastructure the 5 proposed project would implement;

6 (3) Evidence demonstrating the unserved or underserved nature of the community
7 where the proposed project would be located;

8 (4) The number of households that would have new access to broadband internet 9 service, or whose broadband internet service would be upgraded, as a result of the project;

10 (5) A list of significant community institutions that would benefit from the 11 proposed project;

- 12 (6) Evidence demonstrating community support for the proposed project;
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(7) The total cost of the proposed project;

(8) A list identifying sources of funding or in-kind contributions for the project that
 would supplement any awarded grant; and

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(9) Any other information required by the department of economic development. 620.2455. 1. Within three business days of the close of the grant application process, the department of economic development shall publish on its website the proposed geographic areas and proposed broadband internet speeds for each application submitted.

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2. A broadband internet service provider that provides existing service in or adjacent to the proposed project area may submit, within forty-five days of publication of the information under subsection 1 of this section, to the department of economic development a written challenge to an application. Such challenge shall contain information demonstrating that:

9 (1) The provider currently provides or has begun construction to provide 10 broadband internet service within the proposed project area at speeds of at least ten 11 megabits per second download and one megabit per second upload; or

12 (2) The provider commits to complete construction of broadband internet 13 infrastructure and provide broadband internet service in the proposed project area at 14 speeds of at least ten megabits per second download and one megabit per second upload 15 within eighteen months of the date the challenge is submitted to the department.

16 **3.** The department of economic development shall evaluate each challenge 17 submitted under this section. If the department determines that the provider's 18 commitment to provide broadband internet service at speeds of at least ten megabits per 19 second download and one megabit per second upload in the proposed project area is 20 credible, the department shall not fund the challenged project.

4. If the department of economic development denies funding to an applicant as a result of a broadband internet service provider challenge under this section and such broadband internet service provider does not fulfill its commitment to provide broadband internet service in the project area, the department of economic development shall not consider another challenge from such broadband internet service provider for the next two grant cycles, unless the department determines the failure to fulfill the commitment was due to circumstances beyond the broadband internet service provider's control.

620.2456. 1. The department of economic development shall give priority to 2 applications with proposed projects in areas identified by the department as unserved.

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2. The department of economic development may give priority to applications:

4 (1) If ninety percent of the geographical area of the state has access to broadband 5 internet service at speeds of at least ten megabits per second download and one megabit per 6 second upload, that propose projects in areas identified by the department as underserved; HCS HB 1872

7 (2) That offer new or substantially upgraded broadband internet service to 8 important community institutions including, but not limited to, libraries, educational 9 institutions, public safety facilities, and health care facilities;

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(3) That would facilitate the use of telemedicine and electronic health records;

(4) That serve economically distressed areas of the state, as measured by indices of
 unemployment, poverty, or population loss that are significantly greater than the statewide
 average;

14 (5) That provide technical support and training to residents, businesses, and 15 institutions in the community of the proposed project to utilize broadband internet service;

16 (6) That include plans to actively promote the adoption of the newly available17 broadband internet service in the community;

18 (7) That demonstrate strong support for the proposed project from citizens,
 19 businesses, and institutions in the community;

(8) That would provide broadband internet service to a greater number of unserved
 or underserved households and businesses; or

(9) That leverage greater amounts of funding for the project from other sources,
 private or public.

The department of economic development shall endeavor to award grants under
 sections 620.2450 to 620.2458 to qualified applicants in all regions of the state.

620.2457. 1. No grant awarded under sections 620.2450 to 620.2458 shall fund 2 more than fifty percent of the total cost of a project.

3 2. No single project shall be awarded grants under sections 620.2450 to 620.2458
4 whose cumulative total exceeds five million dollars.

620.2458. By June thirtieth of each year, the department of economic development shall publish on its website and provide to the general assembly a list of all applications for grants under sections 620.2450 to 620.2458 received during the previous year and, for each application:

5 (1) The results of any quantitative weighting scheme or scoring system the 6 department of economic development used to award grants or rank the applications;

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(2) The grant amount requested; and

(3) The grant amount awarded, if any.

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
