	WHEREAS, steamboats are deeply entwined in Missouri's history and culture; and
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3 4 5	WHEREAS, the Delta Queen steamboat operated for many years and in many areas across the country as top-of-the-line luxury travel and was previously allowed to provide overnight cruises; and
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7 8 9	<b>WHEREAS</b> , the Delta Queen steamboat has carried three different United States presidents and transported delegates of fifty-one other nations during the founding conference of the United Nations; and
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11 12	<b>WHEREAS</b> , the Delta Queen is widely considered the last steamboat of its kind with overnight guest rooms; and
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14 15	<b>WHEREAS</b> , the Delta Queen was once home to Mary Greene, who was one of the first women to become a licensed river pilot; and
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17 18	<b>WHEREAS</b> , the Delta Queen is expected to visit over eighty different ports in the United States when it resumes operation; and
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20 21	<b>WHEREAS</b> , the Delta Queen has established a home port, restaurant, and headquarters in Kimmswick, Missouri; and
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23 24 25	<b>WHEREAS</b> , the Delta Queen Steamboat Company has created over one hundred seventy local jobs and is expected to bring in more than thirty-six million four hundred thousand dollars to the region annually; and

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27 28	WHEREAS, resuming overnight cruises would bring even more economic benefits to the region and create further economic growth and opportunity; and
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30 31 32	WHEREAS, the Delta Queen has been designated as a "National Treasure" by the National Trust for Historic Preservation, listed on the National Register of Historic Places, and declared a National Historic Landmark; and
33 34 35	WHEREAS, the Delta Queen was named to the National Trust for Historic Preservation's "America's 11 Most Endangered Historic Places" in 2016; and
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37 38 39 40	<b>WHEREAS</b> , United States Senate Bill S. 89 exempts old vessels that only operate within the inland waterways from federal fire-retardant materials requirements if the owners of the vessel make annual structural alterations to at least ten percent of the areas of the vessel that are not constructed of fire-retardant materials:
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42 43 44	<b>NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED</b> that we, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives, Ninety-ninth General Assembly, hereby urge the United States Congress to enact United States Senate Bill S. 89; and
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46 47 48	<b>BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED</b> that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for each member of Missouri's congressional delegation.
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
