AN ACT

To amend chapter 34, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the state technology modernization fund.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 34, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 34.625, to read as follows:

- 34.625. 1. Any department or agency of the state having any unexpended state general revenue or other eligible funds at the end of the fiscal year may request the state treasurer to deposit such funds into the state technology modernization fund established pursuant to this section.
- 2. There is hereby created in the state treasury the "State Technology Modernization Fund", which shall consist of moneys deposited under this section. The state treasurer shall be custodian of the fund. In accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180, the state treasurer may approve disbursements. The fund shall be a dedicated fund and moneys in the fund shall be used solely by the department that requested funds be deposited into it for the purpose of making modernized technology purchases. The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other funds are invested.
- 3. Any department or agency of the state that has requested unexpended state funds to be deposited into the state technology modernization fund pursuant to this section may collaborate with another department or agency of the state for the purpose of making modernized technology purchases that will be shared by such departments or agencies.
- 4. Any funds deposited into the state technology modernization fund that are not expended by a department or agency within three years of deposit shall revert to general revenue.

- 5. For purposes of this section, the following terms mean:
- 20 (1) "Cloud computing service", a service that enables ubiquitous, convenient, 21 on-demand network access to a shared pool of configurable computing resources and can 22 be rapidly provisioned and released with minimal management effort or service provider 23 interaction;
 - (2) "Modernized technology purchase", any purchase of technology whose primary purpose is to update hardware or software, promote government efficiency through shared services among state departments or state agencies, or enhance cloud computing services.
