#### AN ACT

To repeal section 570.130, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to fraudulent use of certain devices, with a penalty provision.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 570.130, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 570.130, to read as follows:

570.130. 1. A person commits the offense of fraudulent use of a credit device or debit 2 device if he or she uses a credit device or debit device for the purpose of obtaining services or 3 property, knowing that:

4 (1) The device is stolen, fictitious, or forged; [or]

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(3) For any other reason his or her use of the device is unauthorized; or

(2) The device has been revoked or cancelled; [or]

7 (4) Uses a credit device or debit device for the purpose of paying property taxes and 8 knowingly cancels such charges or payment without just cause. It shall be prima facie evidence 9 of a violation of this section if a person cancels such charges or payment after obtaining a 10 property tax receipt to obtain license tags from the Missouri department of revenue.

The offense of fraudulent use of a credit device or debit device is a class [A
 misdemeanor unless the value of the property tax or the value of the property or services
 obtained or sought to be obtained within any thirty-day period is seven hundred fifty dollars or

14 more, in which case fraudulent use of a credit device or debit device is a class] E felony.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

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3. Any person guilty of the offense of fraudulent use of a credit device or debit
device shall not be eligible for probation or parole until such person has served at least
three hundred sixty-five days of his or her sentence.

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
