HCS HB 1364 -- TRANSPORTATION AND DELIVERY OF PETROLEUM PRODUCTS

SPONSOR: Kidd

COMMITTEE ACTION: Voted "Do Pass with HCS" by the Special Committee on Homeland Security by a vote of 7 to 1. Voted "Do Pass" by the Rules- Legislative Oversight Committee by a vote of 9 to 0.

Currently, certain provisions relating to fees collected for the transportation and delivery of petroleum products are due to expire on August 28, 2018. This bill begins the fee collection on August 28, 2018, and extends the expiration date to August 28, 2025.

This bill is the same as SB 515 (2017).

PROPONENTS: Supporters say that a large percentage of the fees collected under this program are returned to the local community, there is no state funding, and they even try to use as much as they can from the 25% of the funds that go to the Missouri Emergency Response Commission.

Testifying for the bill were Representative Kidd; Missouri Petroleum Marketers and Convenience Store Association; Paul Kirchhoff, Missouri Emergency Response Commission; and Ron Walker, Missouri State Emergency Management Agency.

OPPONENTS: There was no opposition voiced to the committee.
