HB 2422 -- HUMAN TRAFFICKING AND CHILD EXPLOITATION PREVENTION ACT

SPONSOR: Neely

This bill establishes the "Human Trafficking and Child Exploitation Prevention Act," which puts a duty on distributors of "obscene material" or "revenge pornography," both defined in the bill, to provide specific blocking software to restrict access to certain material. The bill allows the Attorney General or prosecuting attorney to seek injunctive relief against a distributor that allows access to content or a website in violation of the provisions of the bill. A distributor that knowingly violates these provisions shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and be punished by imprisonment of less than one year or by a fine of up to \$500 for each violation. This bill specifies the circumstances under which a distributor shall deactivate the blocking software.

The bill creates the "Human Trafficking And Child Exploitation Prevention Fund," which shall include appropriated money, gifts, grants, donations, bequests, and money collected under the provisions of this bill.
