6	exposed to a controlled substance listed in section 195.017, schedules I, II and III, or alcohol as
7	evidenced by:
8	(1) Medical documentation of signs and symptoms consistent with controlled substances or
9	alcohol exposure in the child at birth; or
0	(2) Results of a confirmed toxicology test for controlled substances performed at birth on
1	the mother or the child; and
2	(3) A written assessment made or approved by a physician, health care provider, or by the
3	children's division which documents the child as being at risk of abuse or neglect.
4	2. Nothing in this section shall preclude a physician or other mandated reporter from
5	reporting abuse or neglect of a child as required pursuant to the provisions of section 210.115.
6	3. Any physician or health care provider complying with the provisions of this section, in
7	good faith, shall have immunity from any civil liability that might otherwise result by reason of such
8	actions.
9	4. Referral and associated documentation provided for in this section shall be confidential
0	and shall not be used in any criminal prosecution."; and

2	Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references
3	accordingly.
