1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 468, Page 2, Section 8.007, Lines 2-3,
2 by deleting the phrase "and 8.177"; and

3
4 Further amend said bill and section, Page 2, Lines 16-19, by deleting all of said lines and inserting
5 in lieu thereof the following:

7 "(4) Evaluate and recommend courses of action on the restoration and preservation of the";
8 and

10 Further amend said bill and section, Pages 2-3, by renumbering subsequent subdivisions
11 accordingly; and

13 Further amend said bill and section, Page 3, Line 62, by inserting after said section and line the
14 following:

16 "8.111. 1. There is hereby established the "Capitol Police Board" which shall be composed
17 of five members, as follows:

18 (1) The governor, or his or her designee;

19 (2) The speaker of the house of representatives, or his or her designee;

20 (3) The president pro tempore of the senate, or his or her designee;

21 (4) The chief justice of the Missouri supreme court, or his or her designee; and

22 (5) The chair of the state capitol commission.

23
24 The lieutenant governor, the chief clerk of the house of representatives, and the secretary of the
25 senate, or their designees, shall serve as ex officio members of the board but shall not have the
26 power to vote. At the first meeting of the board and at yearly intervals thereafter, the members shall
27 select from amongst themselves a chair, a vice chair and a secretary.

28 2. The board shall be assigned to the house of representatives with supervision by the house
29 of representatives only for budgeting and reporting. Such supervision shall not extend to matters
30 relating to policies, regulative functions, or appeals from activities of the board, and no member or
31 employee of the house of representatives shall participate in or interfere with the activities of the
32 board in any manner not specifically provided by law, or at the direction of the board, and no
33 member or employee of the house of representatives shall interfere in any manner with any budget
34 request of or with respect to the withholding of any moneys appropriated to the board by the general
35 assembly.

36 3. The board shall provide for public safety at the seat of government, and for the safety and

1 security of elected officials, government employees, and their guests as needed outside the seat of
 2 government. The board shall hire police officers as described in section 8.177.

3 4. The board shall hire a chief of police who shall be certified under chapter 590 and serve
 4 subject to the supervision, and at the pleasure, of the board. The chief of police shall:

5 (1) Oversee the administrative operations of the capitol police and perform such other duties
 6 as may be delegated or assigned to the chief by law or by the board;

7 (2) Retain contract services as he or she deems necessary, within the limits authorized by
 8 appropriations by the general assembly;

9 (3) Appoint a security detail, both inside and outside the seat of government, for the
 10 lieutenant governor, members of the general assembly, and any other person when the chief, speaker
 11 of the house of representatives, and the president pro tempore deem such security detail necessary.

12 5. The board may promulgate rules relating to the provisions of sections 8.111 to 8.178.
 13 Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010 that is created under the
 14 authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all
 15 of the provisions of chapter 536, and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536
 16 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536,
 17 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held
 18 unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after
 19 August 28, 2019, shall be invalid and void.

20 8.170. The ~~[director]~~ Missouri capitol police shall prosecute, in the name of the state, for all
 21 trespasses and injuries of every kind done to the public buildings and other property, and shall attend
 22 to the suits relative to the same. The attorney general shall give counsel, or prosecute suits, when
 23 required by the ~~[director]~~ chief.

24 8.172. The ~~[commissioner of administration]~~ capitol police board shall make rules and
 25 regulations for the regulation of traffic and parking at all parking space upon the capitol grounds and
 26 upon the grounds of other state buildings located within the capital city. The regulations shall be
 27 enforced by the Missouri capitol police."; and

 29 Further amend said bill, Page 4, Section 8.177, Lines 1-2 and 10, by deleting both instances of the
 30 phrase "Missouri state capitol commission" and inserting in lieu thereof the phrase "capitol police
 31 board"; and

 33 Further amend said bill, page, and section, Line 21, by inserting after said section and line the
 34 following:

 36 "8.178. Any person who violates sections 8.172 to ~~[8.174, or section]~~ 8.177, or any of the
 37 traffic or parking regulations of the ~~[commissioner]~~ capitol police board shall be punished as
 38 follows:

39 (1) Fines for traffic violations shall not, except as provided by section 301.143, exceed five
 40 dollars for overparking, fifteen dollars for double parking and fifty dollars for speeding[-]; and

41 (2) The circuit court of Cole County has authority to enforce ~~[this law]~~ the traffic or parking
 42 regulations of the capitol police board."; and

 44 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references
 45 accordingly.
