FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§42.047 - Green Alert System

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri State Highway Patrol (MHP)** state the Criminal Justice Information Services Division (CJISD) has developed the capability in the Missouri Uniform Law Enforcement System (MULES) for Amber Alerts, Blue Alerts, and the Endangered Silver Advisory. A process is also in place, but not yet implemented locally, that would allow local agencies to request one of these alert types through MULES. This existing workflow could also be used for Green Alerts. There would be some technical work to incorporate the various regions this bill outlines and to ensure the alert sent to television broadcasters is only regional rather than statewide in the case of an Amber Alert. Given the infrastructure is already there, the MHP assumes the work to accomplish this should be minimal and can be absorbed.

Oversight notes that the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, **Department of Public** Safety (Office of the Director and Veterans' Commission), Department of Transportation, Joint Committee on Administrative Rules, Missouri Lottery Commission, Joplin Police Department, St. Louis County Police Department and St. Louis County Justice Services have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organizations.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** state many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$5,000. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

ASSUMPTION (continued)

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could require additional resources.

Oversight only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other police departments were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not.
