FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **Platte County Board of Elections** the proposal will cost \$1,200 annually for pre-printed absentee applications.

Officials from the **St. Louis County Board of Elections** assume the proposal will have a fiscal impact costing \$25,000. They will need to buy new software to build a database for a number tracking system.

Officials from the **Kansas City Election Board** assume the financial effects of the proposal would be minimal on their operations.

Officials from the **Buchanan County** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. Buchanan County currently is already doing what the proposal enacts.

Officials from the **Mississippi County Recorder of Deeds** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Oversight notes there could be a cost for the local election authorities to implement a numbering system for application for absentee ballots. Oversight has no way of identifying the current software programs or existing systems used by local election authorities. Therefore, Oversight will reflect an negative unknown fiscal impact.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill requires the use of a copy of photographic identification for use with any application for an absentee ballot that is not made in person to the election authority. Only the election authority will process the application for an absentee ballot, of any type. Each election authority shall establish a numbering system for absentee ballots to ensure proper tracking and compliance.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
