FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **City of Kansas City** assume this may have a negative impact on the City in an indeterminate amount. A private citizen's action of boarding, mowing, removing debris and graffiti from City owned properties may result in injury and harm from pre-existing conditions on the property and cause the City to be exposed to unnecessary liability.

Oversight assumes should this proposal be enacted, the City would take some kind of legal action to post notice of "enter at your own risk" or have liability insurance on City owned property which would not make the City liable to claims of any private citizen's action. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a \$0 fiscal impact for this proposal.

Officials at the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Oversight notes that the Office of the State Courts Administrator has stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.
