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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **Kansas City Election Board** assume the proposal would have fiscal impact of roughly \$10,000 per election for additional temporaries, overtime, postage, and printing to process the additional absentee voters.

Oversight notes there could be a potential increase in absentee ballots if this proposal were to be enacted. We are unable to determine how many additional individuals 60 and over will cast an absentee ballot; however, Oversight will reflect a zero to unknown fiscal impact for the additional cost to local election authorities.

Officials from the **Platte County Board of Elections**, **Buchanan County**, **Mississippi County**, **St. Louis County Board of Elections**, and **Jackson County Election Board** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Oversight only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other local election authorities and county clerks were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not.
