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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Section 324.520

Officials from the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration (DIFP)** estimate there will be 85 practitioners and 15 establishments that practice "A mark made on the face or body of another person for cosmetic purposes or to any part of the body for scar coverage or other corrective purposes by the insertion of a permanent or semipermanent pigment under the skin with the air of needles, blades, or other instruments."

FY 2020

85 practitioners x \$100 fee = \$8,500 15 establishments at \$200 fee = \$3,000

The next renewal will be in FY 21. This legislation does not require additional FTE and the department believes it can absorb the additional workload. However until the FY20 budget is final, the department cannot identify specific funding sources. Should the cost be more than anticipated, the department would request an increase to our FTE and appropriations as appropriate through the budget process.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

Any small business that now falls into the new definition of tattoo will be fiscally impacted by the proposed legislation.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill changes the definition of tattoo in an effort to ensure that new cosmetic procedures performed with the aid of needles or blades are subject to the tattooing requirements of Chapter 324, RSMo.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
