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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§§167.181, 174.335, 174.335, 191.260 and 210.003 - Children who are not immunized

Officials from the **University of Missouri (UM)** state the fiscal impact of this proposal is unable to be determined.

Oversight contacted UM officials regarding their statement that the fiscal impact of this proposal could not be determined. <u>UM officials state they currently accept students who are not immunized</u>. Based on information received from the Executive Director of the Student Health Center, two years ago they had a student who was not immunized that contracted mumps. This spring they had a student that was not immunized that was found to have TB. UM was able to activate teams to isolate the students, so the disease did not spread. UM officials are concerned there could be consequences should these diseases spread before the University can take action.

Oversight notes that the **Missouri Office of Prosecution Services** have stated the proposal would not have a measurable fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for this organization.

Oversight notes that the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education**, the **Department of Higher Education**, the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, the **Department of Mental Health**, the **Department of Social Services**, the **Office of State Courts Administrator**, the **Andrew County Health Department**, the **Audrain County Health Department**, the **Bollinger County Health Center**, the **Columbia/Boone County Department of Public Health and Human Services**, the **Clay County Public Health Center**, the **Francis Howell School District**, the **Missouri State University**, and **State Technical College of Missouri** have each stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these organizations.

Oversight only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other local public health agencies, schools, and colleges and universities were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. 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ASSUMPTION (continued)

Oversight notes, based on information from UM officials, that the University does not currently discriminate against students that are not immunized. Provisions in this proposal provide that no child shall be discriminated against because he or she has not been immunized as required due to an exemption. Oversight assumes that this proposal does not create any new exemptions for unvaccinated children as it is already illegal to discriminate against any individual on a medical or religious basis.

As noted above, Oversight requested a fiscal impact information regarding this bill to school districts (on January 28, 2019) and only one school district has responded. Upon the receipt of other responses from school districts, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval of the chairperson of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research to publish a new fiscal note.
