### FISCAL ANALYSIS

### ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Missouri Ethics Commission (MEC)** assume the proposed legislation does not have a fiscal impact on the MEC. However, if the Commission receives a significant number of complaints relating to this provision, additional staff would be required to provide the proper oversight.

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR)** state this legislation is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact beyond its current appropriation.

**Oversight** assumes JCAR will be able to administer any rules resulting from this proposal with existing resources.

Department of Public Safety-National Guard. Office of the State Treasurer, Office of the Governor, Department of Revenue, Missouri Lottery Commission, MoDOT and Patrol Employees Retirement System, Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, Department of Higher Education, Office of the State Public Defender, Missouri Tax Commission, Missouri State Employees' Retirement System, Department of Transportation, Department of Public Safety-State Emergency Management Agency, Missouri Senate, Department of Public Safety-Fire Safety, and Office of Prosecution Services each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.
