## AN ACT

To amend chapters 161 and 170, RSMo, by adding thereto two new sections relating to elementary and secondary education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapters 161 and 170, RSMo, are amended by adding thereto 2 two new sections, to be known as sections 161.265 and 170.024, to read as follows:

161.265. 1. Subject to appropriation, the department of 2 elementary and secondary education shall establish a statewide 3 program to be known as the "Internet and Social Media Awareness 4 Program" to increase awareness of appropriate online behavior and 5 skills among students in public schools.

6 2. The department of elementary and secondary education shall 7 consult with the career and technical education advisory council 8 described in section 178.550 in order to develop materials to be used by 9 public schools for the instruction on online behavior required under 10 section 170.024. The career and technical education advisory council 11 shall evaluate the effectiveness of the materials each school year 12 through surveys and data analysis and provide that evaluation to the 13 department of elementary and secondary education.

3. The department of elementary and secondary education may promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536, and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable, and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2019, shall be invalid and void.

170.024. 1. Beginning with the 2020-21 school year and each school year thereafter, each school district and charter school shall  $\mathbf{2}$ maintain a policy on internet and social media awareness. The purpose 3 of such policy shall be to protect the health and well-being of all 4 district and charter school students and ensure that all students have  $\mathbf{5}$ age-appropriate instruction on how to navigate online courses and 6 engage in appropriate online behavior. The policy shall be coordinated 7 with other policies supporting the safety and emotional health of 8 9 students.

2. The internet and social media awareness policy shall ensure
 that all students in fourth grade receive instruction on how to navigate
 online courses and engage in appropriate online behavior.

3. The policy shall specify other age-appropriate educational
experiences at both the elementary and secondary levels to ensure that
all students receive necessary instruction on internet use and social
media awareness.

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
