### AN ACT

To amend chapter 210, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to child care facilities.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:*

Section A. Chapter 210, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be  
2 known as section 210.233, to read as follows:

**210.233. 1. All licensed child care facilities shall report annually to the department  
2 of health and senior services whether the child care facility has liability insurance coverage  
3 and if so, shall provide the department with proof of such insurance coverage.**

**4 2. The department shall publish and update annually on its website whether each  
5 licensed child care facility has liability insurance coverage. Upon request, the department  
6 shall provide insurance coverage information regarding a child care facility, including the  
7 name, address, and telephone number of the facility's liability insurance carrier.**

**8 3. The department may promulgate rules and regulations to implement the  
9 provisions of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section  
10 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective  
11 only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if  
12 applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable, and if any of  
13 the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay  
14 the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held  
15 unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted  
16 after August 28, 2019, shall be invalid and void.**
