2	WHEREAS , the Missouri state capitol shall be freely open to the public to peacefully assemble, to petition their government, and to observe all sessions of the general assembly; and
3	
4	WHEREAS, in 2002 metal detectors were installed at the state capitol after the
5	September 11 attacks but were taken down in 2003; and
6	
7	WHEREAS, the state spent more than \$415,000 to buy and install the new security
8	equipment that is presently in use at the capitol building; and
9	
10	WHEREAS, the state capitol has two metal detectors located at two of the three public
11	entrances; and
12	
13	WHEREAS, the expense of one metal detector will cost the state taxpayers over \$71,000
14	each year, with a total of \$142,000 each year; and
15	
16	WHEREAS, that expense does not include the payroll of the security personnel who sit
17	at each entrance and conduct security screenings on those entering the capitol; and
18	
19	WHEREAS, in 2017 Governor Greitens announced \$146.4 million of spending
20	restrictions because the Missouri budget was suffering from reduced revenue and poor economic
21	growth; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, the cessation of unnecessary spending on security measures at the state
24	capitol will assist in getting Missouri toward the goal of a balanced budget:

26	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of
27	Representatives of the One Hundredth General Assembly, First Regular Session, the Senate
28	concurring therein, hereby urges the Board of Public Buildings to remove the metal detectors and
29	security personnel at the entrances to the Missouri state capitol; and
30	DE IT FUDTUED DESOLVED that the Chief Clark of the Mission of
31	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of Barragentatives he instructed to properly inscribed early of this resolution for each
32	Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for each
33	member of the Board of Public Buildings.
