34	WHEREAS, O'Neil's commitment to preserving the history of the Negro Leagues was
35	unparalleled; and

37	WHEREAS, in 1990, O'Neil led the effort to establish the Negro Leagues Baseball
38	Museum in Kansas City and served as its honorary board chairman until his death in 2006; and

40	WHEREAS, he was inducted into the Baseball Scouts Hall of Fame in 2002; and
