	WHEREAS, the United States military has five branches that offer Junior Reserve
2	Officer Training Corps (JROTC): the Marine Corps, Army, Navy, Air Force, and Coast Guard;
3	and

5	WHEREAS, JROTC courses are offered at over three thousand high schools across the
6	United States; and
7	
8	WHEREAS, participation in the elective JROTC courses does not require students to
9	join the military; and
10	
11	WHEREAS, JROTC courses are not military-preparation courses but teach life skills
12	that are not instilled in many of today's youth: taking orders, punctuality, responsibility, personal
13	hygiene, physical fitness, and respect; and
14	
15	WHEREAS, JROTC courses provide leadership skills and opportunity for
16	underprivileged youth across the state, especially in inner cities; and
17	
18	WHEREAS, students who participate in JROTC receive the opportunity to use firearms
19	correctly and safely as part of firearms training; and

21	WHEREAS, many students in rural areas have no access to JROTC courses due to an

WHEREAS, students deserve access to JROTC courses because the JROTC program creates better, stronger youth; JROTC courses increase the confidence and self-esteem of participants; graduation rates of students in JROTC courses are exponentially higher than the graduation rates of students not enrolled in a JROTC course in their respective schools; attendance rates of students in JROTC courses are higher than those of students not enrolled in

insufficient number of schools offering JROTC courses and the locations of current JROTC

programs, and all Missouri high school students deserve the opportunity to enroll in a JROTC

course, regardless of the location of their school; and
