# AN ACT

To repeal section 116.180, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to ballot language.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 116.180, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 116.180, to read as follows:

116.180. 1. Within three days after receiving the official summary statement the approved fiscal note summary and the fiscal note relating to any statewide ballot measure, the 2 secretary of state shall certify the official ballot title in separate paragraphs with the fiscal note 3 summary immediately following the summary statement of the measure and shall deliver a copy 4 of the official ballot title and the fiscal note to the speaker of the house or the president pro tem 5 of the legislative chamber that originated the measure or, in the case of initiative or referendum 6 petitions, to the person whose name and address are designated under section 116.332. Persons 7 8 circulating the petition shall affix the official ballot title to each page of the petition prior to 9 circulation and signatures shall not be counted if the official ballot title is not affixed to the page 10 containing such signatures.

2. The official ballot title shall be written in plain language. In addition to the
ballot question, the title shall also include examples that illustrate the effects of a yes or no
vote on the ballot question. The examples shall take substantially the following form:

"A "yes" vote on this ballot question would result in the following (insert example).
A "no" vote on this ballot question would result in the following (insert example)."

17 The ballot example shall be limited to no more than fifty words, excluding articles. The

18 fifty words for the ballot example shall be in addition to the fifty words allowed for ballot 19 language under section 116.160. The secretary of state or the general assembly may

propose official ballot titles, including examples. The secretary of state shall not certify a 21 petition with a proposed ballot title that does not satisfy the requirements of this section.

22 The sufficiency and fairness of ballot examples shall be subject to challenge in the same

23 manner as ballot title, as provided in this chapter.
