2 3 4 56	To amend chapter 9, RSMo, by adding thereto thirteen new sections relating to state holiday designations.
7 8 9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:
10	Section A. Chapter 9, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto
11	thirteen new sections, to be known as sections 9.052, 9.090,
12	9.117, 9.152, 9.169, 9.225, 9.227, 9.235, 9.240, 9.275, 9.284,
13	and 9.285 to read as follows:
14	9.052. The first Friday in May each year is hereby
15	designated as "Law Enforcement Appreciation Day" in the state of
16	Missouri. The citizens of this state are encouraged to observe
17	the day with appropriate activities and events to recognize and
18	support the brave men and women who undertake the difficult and
19	sometimes unattainable pledge to protect and serve the public.
20	9.090. November ninth each year is hereby designated and
21	shall be known as "Stars and Stripes Day" in Missouri. The
22	citizens of this state are encouraged to engage in appropriate
23	events and activities to commemorate the creation of the
24	newspaper of the United States Armed Forces, first printed by
25	<u>Union troops on November 9, 1861, using the press of the</u>
26	<u>Bloomfield Herald in Bloomfield, Missouri.</u>
27	9.117. May twenty-sixth of each year shall be known as
28	"Battle of St. Louis Memorial Day" in the state of Missouri.
29	Citizens of this state are encouraged to participate in

1	appropriate events and activities to commemorate the only battle
2	of the American Revolution fought in what would become the state
3	<u>of Missouri.</u>
4	9.152. The month of May is hereby designated as "Mental
5	Health Awareness Month". The citizens of this state are
6	encouraged to participate in appropriate awareness and
7	educational activities that emphasize the importance of good
8	mental health and the effects of mental illness on Missourians.
9	9.166. The month of July shall be known as "Minority Mental
10	Health Awareness Month." The citizens of this state are
11	encouraged to observe the month with appropriate events and
12	activities to raise awareness of the effects of mental illness on
13	minorities.
14	9.169. August thirty-first each year shall be known as
15	"Random Acts of Kindness Day" in Missouri to mark the beginning
16	of suicide prevention awareness month in September. The citizens
17	of this state are encouraged to celebrate this day by engaging in
18	random acts of kindness toward their fellow citizens and
19	remembering that one small act of kindness has the power to
20	change the course of a person's life and the potential to impact
21	countless lives as random acts of kindness are paid forward.
22	9.225. November thirtieth of each year is hereby designated
23	as "Mark Twain Day". The citizens of this state are encouraged
24	to engage in appropriate events and activities to commemorate the
25	life and accomplishments of Mark Twain.
26	9.227. March fifth of each year is hereby designated as
27	"Iron Curtain Speech Day" in Missouri. Citizens of this state

1	are encouraged to celebrate with appropriate events and
2	activities to recognize the anniversary of Winston Churchill's
3	<u>famous speech at Westminster College in Fulton, Missouri, on</u>
4	<u>March 5, 1946.</u>
5	9.235. The second Wednesday in May shall be designated as
6	"Celiac Awareness Day". The citizens of this state are
7	encouraged to participate in appropriate events and activities
8	that increase awareness of celiac disease.
9	9.240. July seventh of each year shall be designated as
10	"Missouri Sliced Bread Day". The citizens of this state are
11	encouraged to participate in appropriate activities and events to
12	commemorate the first sale of sliced bread on July 7, 1928, in
13	<u>Chillicothe, Missouri.</u>
14	9.275. The month of June is hereby designated as
15	"Myasthenia Gravis Awareness Month" in Missouri. The citizens of
16	this state are encouraged to celebrate the month with events and
17	activities to raise awareness about this treatable, but
18	progressive and difficult to diagnose disease.
19	9.284. December twenty-fifth of each year shall be known
20	and designated as "Christmas Day" in the state of Missouri.
21	9.285. September ninth of each year is hereby designated
22	and shall be known as "Diffuse Intrinsic Pontine Glioma Awareness
23	Day" in honor of Adleigh, a young Missourian who lost her battle
24	with this terminal form of childhood cancer. Citizens of this
25	state are encouraged to recognize this day with appropriate
26	events and activities to raise awareness and educate others about
27	<u>this disease.</u>
