## HOUSE COMMITTEE BILL NO. 8

1 2	AN ACT
2 3 4 5 6	To amend chapter 620, RSMo, by adding thereto nine new sections relating to the Missouri Urban and Rural Renewal Workforce Act.
8 9 10	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:
11	Section A. Chapter 620, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto
12	nine new sections, to be known as sections 620.608, 620.609,
13	620.610, 620.611, 620.613, 620.615, 620.616, 620.617, and
14	620.619, to read as follows:
15	620.608. Sections 620.608 to 620.619 shall be known and may
16	be cited as the "Missouri Urban and Rural Renewal Workforce Act".
17	620.609. There is hereby established a "Missouri Urban and
18	Rural Renewal Workforce", which shall provide employability
19	skills training, and meaningful work experience leading to
20	credentials and employment necessary to better prepare the
21	citizens in urban and rural areas for meeting basic work
22	requirements and their civic responsibility.
23	620.610. As used in sections 620.608 to 620.619 the
24	following terms mean:
25	(1) "Corps", the Missouri urban and rural renewal
26	workforce;
27	(2) "Division", the division of workforce development
28	within the department of economic development;
29	(3) "Local workforce development boards", the local

1	workforce development boards established under Section 107 of the
2	Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, 113 Pub. L. 128, or any
3	succeeding administrative body established by subsequent federal
4	legislation to provide for the local administration and
5	expenditure of funding for employment and job training and
6	approved by the division;
7	(4) "Participant", a person who has been hired and who
8	meets the program eligibility criteria established under sections
9	<u>620.608 to 620.619;</u>
10	(5) "Project", an undertaking designed to provide, or
11	assist in providing, services to promote public health,
12	education, or the welfare of the general population. The term
13	includes, but is not limited to:
14	(a) The rehabilitation of substandard housing;
15	(b) The repair, restoration, and maintenance of public
16	facilities and amenities;
17	(c) Assistance with the organization or delivery of
18	educational or health services;
19	(d) Assistance for the homebound elderly;
20	(e) Delivery of food to the hungry and elderly;
21	(f) Restoration or development of park facilities;
22	(g) Trail construction and maintenance;
23	(h) Litter control; and
24	<u>(i) Road repair;</u>
25	(6) "Project sponsor", any state agency including, but not
26	limited to, the department of elementary and secondary education,
27	department of labor and industrial relations, department of

1	natural resources, department of social services, or the
2	University of Missouri extension system; any unit of local
3	government, including school districts; private not-for-profit
4	corporations or organizations; administrative entities designated
5	pursuant to the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, 113
6	Pub. L. 128; or community-based organizations.
7	620.611. 1. The Missouri urban and rural renewal workforce
8	shall consist of a year-round community employment program for
9	urban and rural residents.
10	2. In selecting participants for the corps, the director of
11	the division shall give preference to persons whose income is at
12	or below one hundred eighty-five percent of the federal poverty
13	guidlines, as determined annually by the United States Department
14	of Health and Human Services. The director may segregate
15	programs and funds to serve such persons to enhance the
16	efficiency of administering any federal funds of the Workforce
17	Innovation and Opportunity Act, 113 Pub. L. 128, that are
18	available to the corps.
19	3. Participants shall be at least twenty-five years of age
20	and unemployed at the time of their enrollment.
21	620.613. 1. The employment program shall consist of
22	projects that offer paid work experience integrated with
23	educational activities, which may include, but are not limited
24	to, employability skills training. Participants shall be
25	unemployed at the time of their enrollment.
26	2. Participants in the program shall be paid a wage
27	according to a work plan approved by the division and

1	commensurate with the number of hours worked by the participant.
2	620.615. 1. The division is hereby authorized to
3	administer the Missouri urban and rural renewal workforce
4	programs and adopt rules and regulations governing their
5	operation and participation requirements. Any rule or portion of
6	a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is
7	created under the authority delegated in this section shall
8	become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all
9	of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section
10	536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable, and if
11	any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to
12	chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to
13	disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held
14	unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any
15	rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2019, shall be invalid
16	and void.
17	2. In delivering corps programs, the division shall
18	cooperate with and may directly contract with any state agency,
19	local unit of government, governor's advisory council or
20	commission, private not-for-profit organization, or other private
21	entity. For purposes of this section, the contracting process of
22	the division with these entities need not be governed by the
23	provisions of chapter 34.
24	3. Upon application to the division and subject to the
25	availability of funds, the division is authorized to provide
26	funding assistance through contracts with administrative
27	entities, designated pursuant to the Workforce Innovation and

1	Opportunity Act, 113 Pub. L. 128, and project sponsors. The
2	application shall form the basis for the contract agreement and,
3	at a minimum, shall include:
4	(1) A general project description, including the extent to
5	which it satisfies community development or resource conservation
6	objectives and whether such objectives are stated within any
7	municipal, county, regional, or state agency plan;
8	(2) The number of corps members to be assigned to each
9	project, a description of the nature and duration of their
10	employment or volunteer work, and a description of combinations
11	or sequences of education or vocational training to be provided;
12	(3) The amount of total funds required to sustain the
13	project, distinguishing between the amounts required for corps
14	members' wages and stipends, if any, and the amounts required for
15	<u>other purposes;</u>
16	(4) A statement of the amount and purpose of funding
17	assistance requested from the division and the manner and timing
18	of its disbursement; and
19	(5) A description of the interagency coordination,
20	technical assistance, and financial support that, when combined
21	with the funding assistance, the resources of the applicant, and
22	support from other sources, is sufficient to ensure success of
23	the project. The commitment of financial support from the
24	project sponsor shall be no less than twenty-five percent of the
25	total project cost.
26	4. An application shall only be submitted to the division.
27	It shall include the signatures of the workforce development

1 <u>board chair.</u>

5. The division shall ensure that all affected state 2 3 agencies are made aware of the application and are provided the opportunity to offer comments related to the project feasibility, 4 5 including the identification of other available funds for the 6 project. 7 620.616. 1. A project sponsor shall administer projects funded under sections 620.608 to 620.619 in the following manner: 8 9 (1) Participants, except those enrolled in the volunteer 10 program, shall be paid at least the minimum wage as established by federal or state law at the time of employment; 11 12 (2) Persons employed through any of the corps programs shall be exempt from merit system requirements and shall not be 13 14 eligible for membership in any public employees' retirement system. All participants shall be so advised by the project 15 sponsor and the regulating authority; and 16 (3) Services performed by a participant in any corps 17 18 program shall not constitute "employment" within the meaning of 19 the Missouri employment security law in chapter 288, if the 20 program is operated as a work-relief or work-training program in accordance with subdivision (5) of subsection 9 of section 21 22 288.034. 2. No more than ten percent of the funds distributed to a 23 24 project sponsor may be expended for administrative expenses. 25 Administrative expenses shall be approved by the division. 26 3. No funds shall be awarded for any program that replaces or supplants employees engaged in any authorized work stoppage, 27

1	or that replaces or supplants currently employed workers, or that
2	impairs existing contracts for services provided by other
3	workers.
4	620.617. 1. The Missouri workforce development board,
5	established under section 620.511, shall review and recommend
6	criteria for evaluating project funding assistance, program
7	criteria, and other requirements and priorities to be used by the
8	<u>division in the evaluation and monitoring of Missouri urban and</u>
9	rural renewal workforce projects.
10	2. The division may work with the department of higher
11	education; the department of elementary and secondary education;
12	and any college, university, or lending institution throughout
13	the state to develop a system of academic credit, tuition grants,
14	and deferred loan repayment incentives for urban and rural
15	residents who enroll and complete participation in corps
16	programs. The division shall adopt rules under chapter 536
17	designed to implement any such incentive programs.
18	3. The division shall establish and promote the recruitment
19	of "Show-Me Employers", which shall consist of Missouri-based
20	corporations and businesses agreeing to interview, for
21	entry-level jobs, participants successfully completing a corps
22	program.
23	4. The division shall recognize and promote within the
24	labor exchange system the corps and the potential benefits of
25	hiring participants who have successfully completed any of the
26	corps' programs.
27	620.619. (1) There is hereby created in the state treasury

1	the "Urban and Rural Renewal Workforce Fund", which shall consist
2	of moneys appropriated to it by the general assembly or received
3	as gifts, contributions, grants, or bequests from federal,
4	private, or other sources. The fund shall be a dedicated fund,
5	and moneys in the fund shall be used solely for the purposes of
6	sections 620.608 to 620.619. The general assembly shall
7	appropriate moneys in the urban and rural renewal workforce fund.
8	(2) The state treasurer shall be custodian of the fund. In
9	accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180, the state treasurer
10	may approve disbursements. The state treasurer shall invest
11	moneys in the fund in the same manner as other funds are
12	invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such investments
13	shall be credited to the fund.
14	(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080 to the
15	contrary, any moneys remaining in the fund at the end of the
16	biennium shall not revert to the credit of the general revenue
17	<u>fund.</u>
