HB 138 -- SIMON'S LAW

SPONSOR: Kidd

This bill establishes Simon's Law that adds one new section to the law relating to life-sustaining treatment policies of health care facilities. The bill prohibits a health care facility, nursing home, physician, nurse, or medical staff from instituting a do-not-recuscitate order, or similar physician's order for any child who is not emancipated or under juvenile or family court jurisdiction without oral or written permission of at least one parent or legal quardian.

The bill includes provisions for exceptions when parents or legal guardians are not successfully contacted after diligent efforts, for children under court jurisdiction, and those with relative caretakers.

Permission previously given under the provisions of the bill may be revoked in writing by the legal guardian or either parent of the patient.

The provisions do not require any treatment to be continued if it is medically inappropriate or would not result in further benefit or recovery of the patient.

This bill is the same as HCS HB 1361 (2018).
