HB 269 -- ELECTIONS

SPONSOR: Shaul (113)

This bill requires candidates to pay filing fees directly to the treasurer of the appropriate political party committee whenever a declaration of candidacy for a particular office is required to be filed with the Office of the Secretary of State.

The bill authorizes the Secretary of State to use subpoena power for specified investigations. The Secretary of State or his or her representatives may assemble records and documents, by subpoena or otherwise. The subpoena power is exercised only at the specific written direction of the Secretary of State or his or her chief deputy. The subpoena authority includes all records set forth in Section 115.943, RSMo. If any person refuses to comply with a subpoena, the Secretary of State shall seek to enforce the subpoena before a court of competent jurisdiction to require the production of books, papers, correspondence, memoranda, contracts, agreements, and other records. The court may issue an order requiring the person to produce records relating to the matter under investigation and may hold the person in contempt for failure to comply with the order.
