

HB 432 -- DRIVER'S LICENSE ISSUANCE PROCEDURES

The bill allows the Department of Revenue to remotely issue a driver's license, instruction permit, or nondriver's license in extraordinary circumstances using a prior digital image on file. A duplicate driver's license, nondriver's license, or instruction permit may be issued through a remote or mail-in application for an applicant having more than six months remaining in his or her prior issuance term. A renewal driver's license, nondriver's license, or instruction permit may be issued to any applicant in extraordinary circumstances through a remote or mail-in application. Only one remote or mail-in renewal shall be allowed between each in-person application.

Any applicant requesting a remote or mail-in application who is homebound due to a medical disability or injury shall be eligible for a nondriver's license only. "Extraordinary circumstances" includes out-of-state military contractors, their dependents, missionaries, and applicants who are homebound due to a medical disability or injury.

A provision involving concealed carry endorsements that are now issued by individual sheriff offices is also repealed.
