

HB 1005 -- BLEEDING CONTROL TRAINING

SPONSOR: Neely

Beginning with the 2020-21 school year this bill requires high school students to receive 60 minutes of training in life-threatening bleeding control upon graduation. The training shall be included into the school's existing health or physical education curriculum.

The bill requires that the instructional materials must be developed or endorsed by:

- (1) The American College of Surgeons;
- (2) The National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians;
- (3) The Department of Health and Senior Services; or
- (4) A nationally recognized program.

This bill specifies that the instructor meet requirements as outlined within the bill and schools may develop agreements with specified groups to assist in this training.
