As used in this section, the following terms shall mean: (1) "Administer", the direct application of an epinephrine auto-injector to the body of an individual; 7 (2) "Authorized entity", any entity or organization at or in connection with which allergens capable 8 of causing anaphylaxis may be present including, but not limited to, qualified first responders, as such term is 9 defined in section 321.621, restaurants, recreation camps, youth sports leagues, amusement parks, and sports 10 arenas. "Authorized entity" shall not include any public school or public charter school; (3) "Epinephrine auto-injector", a single-use device used for the automatic injection of a 11 premeasured dose of epinephrine into the human body; 12 13 (4) "Physician", a physician licensed in this state under chapter 334; 14 (5) "Provide", the supply of one or more epinephrine auto-injectors to an individual; 15 (6) "Self-administration", a person's discretionary use of an epinephrine auto-injector. 16 2. A physician may prescribe epinephrine auto-injectors in the name of an authorized entity for use 17 in accordance with this section, and pharmacists, physicians, and other persons authorized to dispense 18 prescription medications may dispense epinephrine auto-injectors under a prescription issued in the name of 19 an authorized entity. 20 3. An authorized entity may acquire and stock a supply of epinephrine auto-injectors under a 21 prescription issued in accordance with this section. Such epinephrine auto-injectors shall be stored in a 22 location readily accessible in an emergency and in accordance with the epinephrine auto-injector's 23 instructions for use and any additional requirements established by the department of health and senior 24 services by rule. An authorized entity shall designate employees or agents who have completed the training 25 required under this section to be responsible for the storage, maintenance, and general oversight of epinephrine auto-injectors acquired by the authorized entity. 26 27 4. An authorized entity that acquires a supply of epinephrine auto-injectors under a prescription 28 issued in accordance with this section shall ensure that: 29 (1) Expected epinephrine auto-injector users receive training in recognizing symptoms of severe allergic reactions including anaphylaxis and the use of epinephrine auto-injectors from a nationally 30 31 recognized organization experienced in training laypersons in emergency health treatment or another entity or 32 person approved by the department of health and senior services; 33 (2) All epinephrine auto-injectors are maintained and stored according to the epinephrine autoinjector's instructions for use: 34 35 (3) Any person who provides or administers an epinephrine auto-injector to an individual who the 36 person believes in good faith is experiencing anaphylaxis activates the emergency medical services system as 37 soon as possible; and 38 (4) A proper review of all situations in which an epinephrine auto-injector is used to render 39 emergency care is conducted. 40 5. 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1 issued in accordance with this section shall notify the emergency communications district or the ambulance

2 3 4 dispatch center of the primary provider of emergency medical services where the epinephrine auto-injectors are to be located within the entity's facility.

6. No person shall provide or administer an epinephrine auto-injector to any individual who is under 5 eighteen years of age without the verbal consent of a parent or guardian who is present at the time when 6 7 provision or administration of the epinephrine auto-injector is needed. Provided, however, that a person may provide or administer an epinephrine auto-injector to such an individual without the consent of a parent or 8 guardian if the parent or guardian is not physically present and the person reasonably believes the individual 9 shall be in imminent danger without the provision or administration of the epinephrine auto-injector.

10 7. The following persons and entities shall not be liable for any injuries or related damages that 11 result from the administration or self-administration of an epinephrine auto-injector in accordance with this 12 section that may constitute ordinary negligence:

13 (1) An authorized entity that possesses and makes available epinephrine auto-injectors and its 14 employees, agents, and other trained persons: 15

- (2) Any person who uses an epinephrine auto-injector made available under this section;
- (3) A physician that prescribes epinephrine auto-injectors to an authorized entity; or
- (4) Any person or entity that conducts the training described in this section.

19 Such immunity does not apply to acts or omissions constituting a reckless disregard for the safety of others or 20 willful or wanton conduct. The administration of an epinephrine auto-injector in accordance with this section 21 shall not be considered the practice of medicine. The immunity from liability provided under this subsection 22 is in addition to and not in lieu of that provided under section 537.037. An authorized entity located in this 23 state shall not be liable for any injuries or related damages that result from the provision or administration of 24 an epinephrine auto-injector by its employees or agents outside of this state if the entity or its employee or 25 agent is not liable for such injuries or related damages under the laws of the state in which such provision or 26 administration occurred. No trained person who is in compliance with this section and who in good faith and 27 exercising reasonable care fails to administer an epinephrine auto-injector shall be liable for such failure.

28 8. All basic life support ambulances and stretcher vans operated in the state shall be equipped with 29 epinephrine auto-injectors and be staffed by at least one individual trained in the use of epinephrine auto-30 injectors.

31 9. The provisions of this section shall apply in all counties within the state and any city not within a 32 county.

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10. Nothing in this section shall be construed as superseding the provisions of section 167.630."; and

38 "321.621. 1. For the purposes of this section, "qualified first responder" shall mean any state and 39 local law enforcement agency staff, fire department personnel, fire district personnel, or licensed emergency 40 medical technician who is acting under the directives and established protocols of a medical director who 41 comes in contact with a person suffering from an anaphylactic reaction and who has received training in 42 recognizing and responding to anaphylactic reactions and the administration of epinephrine auto-injector 43 devices to a person suffering from an apparent anaphylactic reaction. "Qualified first responder agencies" shall mean any state or local law enforcement agency, fire department, or ambulance service that provides 44 45 documented training to its staff related to the administration of epinephrine auto-injector devices in an 46 apparent anaphylactic reaction. 47 2. The director of the department of health and senior services, if a licensed physician, may issue a 48 statewide standing order for epinephrine auto-injector devices for adult patients to fire protection districts in 49 nonmetropolitan areas in Missouri as such areas are determined according to the United States Census 50 Bureau's American Community Survey, based on the most recent of five-year period estimate data in which 51 the final year of the estimate ends in either zero or five. If the director of the department of health and senior 52 services is not a licensed physician, the department of health and senior services may employ or contract with 53 a licensed physician who may issue such a statewide order with the express consent of the director.

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1	3. Possession and use of epinephrine auto-injector devices for adult patients shall be limited as
2	follows:
3	(1) No person shall use an epinephrine auto-injector device pursuant to this section unless such
4	person has successfully completed a training course in the use of epinephrine auto-injector devices for adult
5	patients approved by the director of the department of health and senior services. Nothing in this section
6	shall prohibit the use of an epinephrine auto-injector device:
7	(a) By a health care professional licensed or certified by this state who is acting within the scope of
8	his or her practice; or
9	(b) By a person acting pursuant to a lawful prescription;
10	(2) Every person, firm, organization and entity authorized to possess and use epinephrine auto-
11	injector devices for adult patients pursuant to this section shall use, maintain and dispose of such devices for
12	adult patients in accordance with the rules of the department;
13	(3) Every use of an epinephrine auto-injector device pursuant to this section shall immediately be
14	reported to the emergency health care provider as defined in section 190.246.
15	4. (1) Use of an epinephrine auto-injector device pursuant to this section shall be considered first aid
16	or emergency treatment for the purpose of any law relating to liability.
17	(2) Purchase, acquisition, possession or use of an epinephrine auto-injector device pursuant to this
18	section shall not constitute the unlawful practice of medicine or the unlawful practice of a profession.
19	(3) Any person otherwise authorized to sell or provide an epinephrine auto-injector device may sell
20	or provide it to a person authorized to possess it pursuant to this section.
21	5. (1) There is hereby created in the state treasury the "Epinephrine Auto-injector Devices for Fire
22	Personnel Fund", which shall consist of money collected under this section. The state treasurer shall be
23	custodian of the fund. In accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180, the state treasurer may approve
24	disbursements. The moneys in the fund as set forth in this section shall be subject to appropriation by the
25	general assembly for the particular purpose for which collected. The fund shall be a dedicated fund and
26	money in the fund shall be used solely by the department of health and senior services for the purposes of
27	providing epinephrine auto-injector devices for adult patients to qualified first responder agencies as used in
28	this section.
29	(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080 to the contrary, any moneys remaining in the
30	fund at the end of the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the general revenue fund.
31	(3) The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other funds are
32	invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be credited to the fund."; and
