Bill Summary: This proposal authorizes the village of Claycomo to levy, upon voter approval, a sales tax whose revenue is dedicated to public safety.

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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Office of Administration's Division of Budget and Planning (B&P)** assume this proposal allows voters in the Village of Claycomo to impose a sales tax up to 0.50% for the purpose of funding public safety for the village. It also adds "villages" to the governing bodies that may impose the tax.

Based upon the Village of Claycomo's FY19 \$25.0 million of taxable sales, B&P estimates that a 0.50% tax will generate \$123,968 in collections. Since the bill indicates that this sales tax would take effect starting April 1, only Q4 of FY21 sales collections would be impacted. This results in the proposed sales tax generating approximately \$30,992 for the village for FY21. As a voter-approved tax, the collected revenues will not impact general and total state revenues; however, DOR will retain 1% to offset collection costs. Therefore, this portion could increase general and total state revenues by approximately \$313 in FY21.

Budget and Planning defers to DOR for more specific estimates of actual collection costs.

Officials at the **Department of Revenue (DOR)** assume this proposal would allow the Village of Claycomo to authorize and impose up to one-half of one percent, and shall be imposed solely for the purpose of improving the public safety. Using taxable sales report data for the Village of Claycomo, DOR estimates the impact as follows:

Conversion of Taxable Sales by Calendar Year to Fiscal Year

Once converted to Fiscal Years, DOR took the taxable sales times the proposed tax rate of one-half of one percent to determine the total amount of the sales tax collected. DOR notes that this proposal allows DOR to retain 1% that is deposited into General Revenue for expenses for collection of this tax.

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ASSUMPTION (continued)

DOR notes that this proposal would become effective on August 28, 2020 and the first election would be the April 6, 2021 election. Therefore this will not have a fiscal impact in FY 2021. This sales tax would begin October 1, 2021 (FY 2022) if adopted by the voters. Therefore the impact in FY 2022 would be for 9 months.

Officials at the **Village of Claycomo** assume if the voters approve to levy an additional sales tax of .05% from this proposal, the fiscal year income could increase up to \$153,000 annually.

Oversight will range the fiscal impact from \$0 (not approved by voters) to the estimates provided by DOR. Oversight will adjust DOR's estimates for the 1% collection fee for FY 2022.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

This proposal would also allow for a sales tax increase in the Village of Claycomo that would impact small businesses in that Village.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill adds certain villages to the list of cities and villages authorized to impose, upon voter approval, a sales tax of up to .5% for public safety purposes, including expenditures on equipment, city employee salaries and benefits, and facilities for police, fire, and emergency medical providers.

Currently, this only applies to the village of Claycomo.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
