FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Oversight notes the Department of Corrections, the Office of the State Courts

Administrator, the Office of the Attorney General, the Missouri Highway Patrol, the Office of Prosecution Services, the Office of the Secretary of State, the Office of the State Public Defender, the St. Louis County Police Department, the St. Louis County Department of Justice Services and the Springfield Police Department each have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

Oversight also notes according to the Department of Corrections, all offender phone calls are currently recorded. If this legislation passes, the department will have to work with the telephone provider to ensure the calls to the organizations are not provided.

Oversight only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other police and sheriff's departments were requested to respond to this proposed legislation, but did not. A general listing of political subdivisions included in our database is available upon request.
