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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Office of the State Public Defender** assume no fiscal impact from this proposal. This proposal would be for civil actions.

Officials at the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the Office of the Attorney General, the Department of Corrections (DOC), the Department of Public Safety's Office of the Director, the Department of Social Services and the Office of Prosecution Services each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

Oversight notes the Office of the State Public Defender, the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the Office of the Attorney General, the Department of Corrections, the Department of Public Safety's Office of the Director, the Department of Social Services and the Office of Prosecution Services have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note for these agencies.

Oversight inquired about DOC's response for this proposal. DOC states their response is based on their interpretation that the language is referring to the time in which damages from injury or illness caused by childhood sexual abuse can be sought after. It is unknown why DOC's response in 2013 to similar legislation included an unknown impact.
