FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Missouri Ethics Commission** assume the proposal does not have fiscal impact on the Missouri Ethics Commission. However, if a significant number of entities were to begin reporting such activity as outlined in 130.047, RSMo, additional analysts would be required to assist in providing filing assistance and review of reports filed with the Commission. Also, if the Commission identifies significant violations during the process established in Section 105.955.14 (2), (3), RSMo, or complaints received increase significantly an Investigator would be required to provide the proper oversight.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** assume many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$5,000. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could require additional resources.

Officials from the Missouri Senate, Attorney General's Office, Office of the State Treasurer, Office of the State Public Defender, and Department of Corrections each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

In response to a previous version, officials from the **Missouri House of Representatives**, **State Auditor's Office**, and **Office of the Governor** each assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Oversight notes that the above agencies have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.
