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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Oversight notes there could be a potential increase in absentee ballots if this proposal were to be enacted. There may be additional mailing expense for returned voted ballot postage that will be charged to the State of Missouri. The **SOS** stated there may be an increase, but the SOS is not able to quantify it beyond an "unknown." Oversight assumes the cost will not be material, and will reflect a zero to a (Less than \$100,000) annual fiscal impact to the State of Missouri.

Officials from the **Kansas City Election Board** assume the fiscal impact of this proposal would be to hire 2 new permanent employees at \$40,000 each including benefits. Postage and printing per election would increase \$10,000 to handle the increased volume of absentee voters. Legal notices to notify the public about changes to absentee voting would be \$5,000.

In response to similar legislation HB 1393 from 2020, officials from the **Jackson County Election Board** anticipate a 30% increase in mail outs within their jurisdictional boundaries if the proposal should pass. Jackson County Election Board has 250,000 who could qualify under this proposal.

Using Presidential Year 2016 as a guide, the increase in postage costs would be:

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ASSUMPTION (continued)

Oversight notes there could be a potential increase in absentee ballots if this proposal were to be enacted. We are unable to determine how many additional individuals will cast an absentee ballot; therefore, Oversight will reflect an unknown fiscal impact for the additional cost to local election authorities.

Officials from the **St. Louis County Board of Elections**, **Platte County Board of Elections** and **Madison County Clerk** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Oversight only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other local election authorities were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A general listing of political subdivisions included in our database is available upon request.

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FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

Currently, voters using an absentee ballot are required to certify that they are unable to vote on election day by selecting one of a variety of reasons such as absence from the jurisdiction. This bill allows any eligible voter to vote by absentee ballot without stating a reason.

Individuals who are disabled or part of the address confidentiality program may continue to note these conditions on absentee ballot applications so that existing exemptions and protections will continue to apply to them.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
