#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials at the **City of Springfield** assume no immediate fiscal impact to the City. Long-term, there is a potential positive fiscal impact by expanding the number of organizations who can take possession and rehabilitate property, leading to a greater number of rehabilitated properties. However, the degree of fiscal impact is unknowable at this time, as it depends on the number of newly eligible organizations who wish to exercise this option.

**Oversight** notes the City of Springfield has stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

Officials at the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the Office of the Secretary of State, the Department of Commerce and Insurance, the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, the Missouri Veterans Commission and the State Tax Commission each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

Officials at the City of Kansas City and the City of O'Fallon each assume no fiscal impact to their respective entities from this proposal.

**Oversight** notes the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the Office of the Secretary of State, the Department of Commerce and Insurance, the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, the Missouri Veterans Commission, the State Tax Commission, the City of Kansas City and the City of O'Fallon have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

**Oversight** only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other cities and counties were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A general listing of political subdivisions included in our database is available upon request.

## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

There could be a fiscal impact to certain veteran-owned small businesses as a result of this proposal.

### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill changes the definition of "organization" to include veteran-owned businesses, in Sections 447.620 through 447.640, RSMo, which allows certain organizations to take possession of and rehabilitate abandoned real property.

This bill also repeals an exemption in the definition of "parties of interest" that exempts any municipality contained wholly or partially within a county with a charter form of government and with more than 600,000 but less than 700,000 inhabitants.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
