ASSUMPTION

§208.151 - MO HealthNet income eligible adults to be under managed care

Officials from the **Department of Social Services (DSS)** state the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. However, if eligibility is expanded under other legislation to a new population of adults, then this language will require those adults to be served in the Managed Care Program.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect the no fiscal impact assumed by DSS for fiscal note purposes.

Oversight notes MO HealthNet coverage for populations age 19 to 64 who are not aged, blind or disabled, already receive services through managed care. According to the DSS MO HealthNet Division website, managed care for these recipients went statewide in 2017. Therefore, Oversight assumes since the population subject to this legislative proposal already receives services through managed care, this legislation will, in effect, have no direct fiscal impact to DSS under the current MO HealthNet eligibility standards.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services** and the **Department of Mental Health** defer to DSS for the response to this legislation.

Oversight notes the **Department of Corrections** has stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for this organization.
