FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Office of the Secretary of State**, the **Department of Revenue**, the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** and the **State Tax Commission** each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

Officials at the **City of Kansas City**, the **City of Springfield**, the **St. Louis County Board of Elections** and the **Platte County Board of Elections** each assume no fiscal impact to their respective entities from this proposal.

Oversight notes that the Office of the Secretary of State, the Department of Revenue, the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the State Tax Commission, the City of Kansas City, the City of Springfield, the St. Louis County Board of Elections and the Platte County Board of Elections have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note for these agencies.

Officials at the **City of Columbia** assume no fiscal impact unless a candidate for office was determined to be in arrears for and then repaid any delinquent property tax.

Oversight notes in §§105.035 and 115.306.3, a signed affidavit stating that all state income taxes and property taxes, both personal and real, were paid or no taxes are owed for the two fiscal years immediately prior to the filing deadline for the elected office. Oversight assumes any cost would be taken care of by the candidate for office and no fiscal impact would occur from this proposal.

Oversight only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other cities, counties, board of election commissions, local election authorities, ambulance districts and county collectors were requested to respond to this proposed legislation, but did not. A general listing of political subdivisions included in our database is available upon request.
