#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

### **ASSUMPTION**

§571.107 - CCW permit holders not authorized to carry in public libraries

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** state many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$5,000. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

**Oversight** assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could require additional resources.

Oversight notes the Department of Public Safety - Missouri State Highway Patrol, the Springfield Police Department, the St. Louis County Police Department, and the St. Louis County Department of Justice Services have each stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

In response to a similar proposal from 2019 (HB 173), officials from the **Joplin Police Department** and the **Boone County Sheriff's Department** each assumed the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

**Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

**Oversight** only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other police and sheriff's departments were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A general listing of political subdivisions included in our database is available upon request.

# ASSUMPTION (continued)

**Oversight** notes, according to subsection 571.107.2 that a violation of this new location (any public library) would not be a criminal act, but the offender may be subject to denial to the premises or removal from the premises. If the person refuses to leave the premises and a peace officer is summoned, such person may be issued a citation for an amount not to exceed \$100 for the first offense.

Oversight will assume the proposal will not have a fiscal impact.
