FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Department of Health and Senior Services** and the **Department of Social Services** each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

Oversight notes that the Department of Health and Senior Services and the Department of Social Services each has stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

Officials at the **City of St. Louis** assume no fiscal impact from this proposal. The City's Department of Human Services does not incur any administrative costs related to the Senior Citizens' Services Fund.

Officials at St. Louis County did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.

Oversight notes per the St. Louis City Mayor's Office, the City of St. Louis Senior Citizens' Services Fund was established with the passage of Proposition S in November 2016 and was expected to generate about \$2 million annually from a voter-approved property tax. The Fund will support needed services that allow older adults basic assistance to be able to age in place in their own homes, including nutrition, transportation, home repair and home modifications. The City of St. Louis joins 54 other counties in the State of Missouri that have implemented a Senior Services Fund. The funds will be generated by a property tax of 5 cents on every \$100 assessed value.

Oversight notes the following table that shows the Total Assessed Valuation and how much revenue would have been assessed in property taxes to go to this fund from calendar years 2017 and 2018. Oversight will update this table once the 2019 Total Assessed Valuation report is complete.
