### FISCAL ANALYSIS

### **ASSUMPTION**

§571.101 - Lowers the age requirement for a concealed carry permit

Oversight notes the Department of Revenue, the Department of Public Safety - Missouri State Highway Patrol, and the Department of Public Safety - Missouri National Guard have each stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

**Oversight** notes this bill lowers the age requirement from nineteen to eighteen for a concealed carry permit, which may increase the number of CCW applications submitted to county sheriffs. Oversight assumes any increase in revenue to sheriff's departments will be offset by an increase in cost to process the applications for CCW permits. Therefore, the impact to local governments-sheriff's departments will be presented as netting to \$0.

**Oversight** only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, sheriff's departments were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A general listing of political subdivisions included in our database is available upon request.
