FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at **St. Louis City** state the Fiscal Manager of the St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department assumes no measurable fiscal impact from the passage of this legislation. §285.040 of the proposed legislation would remove the residency requirement for all City of St. Louis employees. The City's Department of Personnel stated that the fiscal impact of this bill cannot be determined.

Oversight notes §285.040 removes the residency requirement for all employees of the City of St. Louis. Oversight assumes this section of the proposal could have a potential <u>indirect</u> impact on the City of St. Louis; however, Oversight will reflect no <u>direct</u> fiscal impact for this proposal.

House Amendment #1 - §71.201

Officials at the **Missouri Highway Patrol** assume no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials at the City of Kansas City and the St. Louis County Department of Justice Services each assume no fiscal impact to their respective entities from this proposal.

Oversight notes this amendment adds §71.201 back into the proposal which will affect municipal police forces within the City of St. Louis and the City of Kansas City only if a local governmental unit imposes a residency rule or requirement on law enforcement officers where the personnel reside within one-hour response time. Oversight assumes no direct fiscal impact for this proposal.
