FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **Missouri Ethics Commission (MEC)** assume the proposed language does not have fiscal impact on the Missouri Ethics Commission. However, if the Commission identifies significant violations during the process established in Section 105.955.14 (2), (3), RSMo, or complaints received increase significantly, an Investigator would be required to provide the proper oversight. The Commission can, upon finding probable cause a violation exists recommend or agree to monetary penalties as established in 105.961.4, RSMo. The penalties received by the Commission in enforcement actions are forwarded to the appropriate school district.

Officials from the **Platte County Board of Elections, Jackson County Election Board, Kansas City Election Board** and **St. Louis County Board of Elections** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

Oversight only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other local election authorities were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A general listing of political subdivisions included in our database is available upon request.
