## **ASSUMPTION**

### §195.075 - Prescriptions for ephedrine

Oversight notes the Department of Commerce and Insurance, the Department of Health and Senior Services, the City of Kansas City, the City of Springfield, the St. Louis County Department of Justice Services, the St. Louis County Police Department and the Springfield Police Department have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these organizations.

Officials from the **City of Brentwood** responded to **Oversight's** fiscal note request but did not provide a statement of impact. Oversight assumes, based on the responses received from other local governments, this proposal will have no fiscal impact on the City of Brentwood.

**Oversight** only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other cities, counties, sheriffs' departments and police departments were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A general listing of political subdivisions included in our database is available upon request.
