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#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

§§210.117, 211.038 and 452.375 - Placement of a child

Officials from the **Department of Social Services (DSS)** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

DSS provided the following information to **Oversight** to support their "no fiscal impact" response. According to DSS, policy regarding felony convictions precluding licensure and placement exists in Chapter 6 of the Children's Division Child Welfare Manual available at: https://dssmanuals.mo.gov/child-welfare-manual/section-6-chapter-3-resource-family-assessment -and-licensing-process-subsection-5-conducting-resource-home-renewal/. This information, which covers policy regarding resource home licensure, monitoring and licensure renewal, also includes many requirements supported by the Foster Family Licensing Rules which promote safety for the foster children placed in the licensed resource homes. These can be found at https://www.sos.mo.gov/cmsimages/adrules/csr/current/13csr/13c35-60.pdf. Requirements include criminal and child abuse checks (checks are done using fingerprints from the Missouri State Highway Patrol and Federal Bureau of Investigation, Family Care Safety Registry, Child Abuse and Neglect registry check for Missouri and other states, Case. Net and Sexual Offender Registry by address), home inspection reviews of the physical standards of the home, and preservice training before placement and in-service training requirements to maintain license and renewal. Additionally, monthly visits by caseworkers are completed to ensure children remain safe and also to assist the parents with questions. These ongoing visits ensure that a relationship is maintained between the Children's Division, foster parents and children.

**Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect the no fiscal impact assumed by DSS for fiscal note purposes.

§452.400 - Visitation rights; prohibited persons

**Oversight** notes the **Office of State Courts Administrator** has stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for this organization.
