#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Higher Education and Workforce Development** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **University of Missouri System** assume this proposal could result in lost student revenue to the University of an undetermined amount depending on the number of students that would receive this benefit. We know with current pricing the average full-price tuition and required fees per Missouri Resident student for our four universities is \$10,667 per academic year. And current pricing the average full-price tuition and required fees for Non-Resident students for our four universities is \$28,323 per academic year.

Official from **State Technical College of Missouri** assume there would be a negative fiscal impact, but based on current information, then impact would be minimal.

Officials from **Northwest Missouri State University** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

**Oversight** assumes there could be a loss in revenue for public institutions of higher education from the extension of in-state tuition to dependents of military personnel that are residents of the state.

**Oversight** received a limited number of responses from Colleges & Universities related to the fiscal impact of this proposal. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information available. Upon the receipt of additional responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval to publish a new fiscal note.

**Oversight** only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other Colleges & Universities were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A general listing of political subdivisions included in our database is available upon request.
